"In 1663, the resplendent Palace of Versailles gained a remarkable addition: the Orangerie crafted by the expert design of Louis Le Vau. Strategically positioned to face the sun's embrace from the south and shielded from the chill of prevailing winds by its location beneath the South Parterre, this architectural marvel now graces the palace grounds.

Twenty years later, Jules Hardouin-Mansart expanded the initial structure, transforming the Orangerie into a colossal edifice. Its central gallery stretches over 150 meters, crowned by a soaring 13-meter-high vaulted ceiling. Two side galleries are nestled beneath the monumental Hundred Steps staircases. With walls measuring 4-5 meters in thickness, double windows, and a southern exposure, the Orangeie maintained a winter temperature that never descended below 40 degrees.

Louis XIV, with regal vision, gathered orange trees from royal houses and procured an impressive array of new specimens from Italy, Spain, and Portugal. In the etiquette of the era, courtiers gifted the King their most cherished orange trees. The Versailles Orangerie soon reigned as Europe's largest with an unrivaled collection."

COCKTAILS ET DÎNER DE SUPRÊME ÉLÉGANCE in the magnificent Château de Bagatelle, a Royal Residence in the close



ENVIRONS OF PARIS, in honor of international friendship. This extraordinary dinner soirée, set in the splendor of a historic dwelling, promises to be an evening of a special kind, where you will step into a world of bygone elegance. You will be among the first to dine here after its restoration. A rare invitation indeed. This event is more than a gathering, it's a celebration of beauty and cultural unity in which bonds transcend borders. (dark suit and dressy cocktail attire).

In 1775, Count d'Artois, brother of King Louis XVI and future King Charles X, purchased the Bagatelle estate in the Bois de Boulogne. He wagered with Queen Marie Antoinette that he could build a château in a few weeks during the court's stay at Château de Fontainebleau. His neo-Palladian château was completed in just sixty-four days. Over 900 workers contributed to its construction with prestigious craftsmen decorating the interior. Famed artist Hubert Robert painted six landscapes for a groundfloor boudoir.

Botanist Thomas Blaikie created an English garden



for Bagatelle in 1778, adorned with ponds, rivers, waterfalls, picturesque bridges, pavilions, and sculptures inspired by ancient Egypt, Greece, and Rome. During the 1780s, it became a fashionable pleasure garden, attracting visitors including Thomas Jefferson frequently when he was Ambassador to France.

Spared from destruction during the Revolution, Bagatelle became state property before being acquired by Napoleon I in 1806. The 4th Marquess of Hertford later purchased Bagatelle in 1835. He frequently stayed at his "Bois de Boulogne retreat," receiving Queen Victoria there in 1855 during the Paris International Exhibition. After Lord Hertford's death, his son Sir Richard Wallace inherited Bagatelle and added

a Trianon named after the one at Versailles. Lady Wallace, inheriting the estate in 1890, bequeathed part of the priceless art collection to the British nation, establishing the renowned Wallace Collection in London.

Richard Wallace's secretary inherited Bagatelle and sold it to the City of Paris in 1905. The city's Commissioner for Gardens developed botanical collections while maintaining the harmony of the original English garden. In 1907, the commissioner initiated the Concours International de Roses Nouvelles (International Competition for New Roses), a prestigious event still held each June in the garden's rosarium.

We are extremely appreciative for the opportunity to spend an evening here amidst the captivating beauty of the Bagatelle and its gorgeous garden, an experience made even more special by its rich, historical significance.

A divine evening in the Palace and the Orangerie, that even the Sun King would find radiant! (Black-tie and Long dress) An incredible time when we shall celebrate history, beauty, and international friendship. Stroll up the majestic Escalier Gabriel and wander through the stately and exquisite Appartements du Roi toward the Hall of Mirrors. Experience the majestic and dazzling Galerie des Glaces, one of the most famous and significant rooms in the world, where numerous events of the utmost importance have taken place. Construction began in 1678 by Louis XIV. 357 mirrors are featured

within seventeen arches reflecting seventeen arcaded windows that overlook the breathtakingly beautiful garden vista. An impressive luxury at that time. The ceiling decoration is dedicated to the military victories of Louis XIV. During the 17th century, the Hall of Mirrors was used daily by the King when he walked from his private apartment to the chapel. In the successive

reigns of Louis XV and Louis XVI, the Hall of Mirrors continued to serve for court and family functions. Marriages and births were celebrated in this room, as well as Ambassadors upon presenting their credentials.


Walk through the Apartments to LA SALLE DES GARDES DE LA REINE, the Queens' Guards Room. The American Friends of Versailles remains honored and humbled to have helped restore the exquisite ceiling frescoes and other architectural details in this room to their original beauty. "When Louis XIV installed the Court in Versailles in 1682 he chose other rooms for his personal use, so the King's Grands Appartements became the designated setting for the ceremonies of the Court. The Queen's Grands Appartements, however, remained her living quarters (or the Dauphine's) until the departure of the royal family in 1789. The Queen's Guards Room was the last room of the Queen's Grands Appartements whose paintings and architectural features had not yet been fully restored. In 1680, it became a transition area between the Queen's staircase and the Appartements as such, used as a vestibule in which the officers in charge of the protection of the Queen stationed day and night."

Over 8 million people view this significant room annually. Our visit is on a Saturday evening when the Château is closed, truly a rare privilege.

PRESIDENT OF VERSAILLES, CHRISTOPHE LERIBAULT will then welcome you to a festive dinner set amidst the timeless grandeur of the 17th-century Orangerie and its exquisite garden. Prepare to be swept away by the ambiance infused with the intoxicating fragrance of blooming orange trees. Dance to lively band entertainment by INSPIRATION MUSIC & ARTS with singers, strings, guitar, piano, saxophone, percussion, and a DJ. They have performed for the King of Morocco's Birthday, Kim Kardashian and Kanye West's Wedding, the Bulgari Family party, the Doha Grand Prix, the Opening of Cartier in Paris, and more.

The gala will feature meticulously curated cuisine. In addition, you will have the opportunity to indulge in Tequila and Margarita bars, adding a delightful French-American touch of flair to the culinary experience. In 1948, wealthy American socialite Margaret "Margarita" Sames, famous for her extravagant parties, needed a unique

cocktail for one of her legendary soirées. Drawing on her love for orange Cointreau liquor from France and tequila, she perfected her signature recipe, featuring lime juice and a rim of salt. Her creation, dubbed "The Margarita" by her husband, became an instant hit, spreading by word of mouth among her influential friends. We're pretty sure you'll relish this citrus French-American drink, with its delightful touch of oranges, as you sip it in the enchanting Orangerie at Versailles.

OUR NEW PRESIDENT, ALICIA BRYAN, originates from the vibrant state of Texas. In this light, our gala celebration becomes not only a warm welcome from her, but also a heartfelt tribute to her Texas roots. Après le dîner, the sky will be illuminated by a spectacular, grand display of FEUX D'ARTIFICE, in the manner of the 18th century, perfectly synchronized with the glorious melodies of Baroque music, reminiscent of the era of Louis XIV. An unbelievable feast for the eyes where history and magic will unite in breathtaking harmony!

COCKTAIL RECEPTION AT THE HÔTELS DE SOUBISE ET DE ROHAN. IN PARIS WITH DISTINGUISHED GUEST OF HONOR LE VICOMTE DE ROHAN (OLIVIER) who is the co-founder of the American Friends of Versailles. The Hôtel de Rohan was built during the early 18th century as a private mansion for the Rohan family during the last years of the reign of the Sun King. A powerful French noble family of viscounts, dukes and princes, the Rohan family played an important role in French and European history.

The mansion was designed by the architect Pierre-Alexis Delamair and it is, without doubt, one of the most magnificent palaces in Le Marais, where at the time lived the Parisian elite and many aristocrats. The palace was constructed next to the Hôtel de Soubise, which was also a Rohan family home. The interior decor of the two palaces were reputed to be the best example of how the French elite lived during the early 18th century. By building these two substantial palaces, the Rohans intended to make it clear that after the royal family of France, no other family could

pretend to rank above them, illustrating the famous motto attributed to Louis René Edouard, Prince of Rohan: "Roi ne puis, Prince ne daigne, Rohan suis": "King I cannot, Prince I do not deign, Rohan I am." As a result of a Napoleonic decree after the French Revolution, the Hôtel de Rohan and the adjoining The Hôtel de Soubise became the property of the State and the location of part of the National Archives. The American Friends of Versailles is, indeed, fortunate and thankful to have Olivier, Le Vicomte's continued generous support.

MAGNIFICENT TROIS FONTAINES BOSQUET. The recreation and restoration of this extraordinary treasure was made possible in large part by the American Friends of Versailles. A plaque honoring all of the major contributors was placed at the lower entrance of this grove of three fountains.

André Le Nôtre's garden masterpiece was designed along with the Sun King in 1677 and reopened to its original splendor in 2004. A patriotic ceremony and celebration of our two countries uniting together in the cultural arena, was held then with our national anthems and flags waving. During your visit, the exquisite fountains will be cascading with water reaching to the sky. This Bosquet is a lasting symbol of American-French history and tradition, much like that of the Statue of Liberty.

1:00 pm -3:00 pm DEJEUNER SUR L'HERBE IN THE PETIT TRIANON DOMAIN (PICNIC). Charm and delight will embrace you at this lovely, elegant picnic. The Petit Trianon domain was designed between 1762 – 1768 by Ange-Jacques Gabriel, in the neoclassical style. He was a distinguished architect in the service of Louis XV and is

renowned for his significant contributions to French architecture. Among his most notable achievements are the iconic Place de la Concorde, the prestigious École Militaire, and the exquisite Petit Trianon and Royal Opera Theater, both gracing the Palace of Versailles. His architectural style masterfully navigated the delicate equilibrium between the opulence of French Baroque and the elegant restraint of

French neoclassicism. Louis XVI gave it to his queen, Marie-Antoinette, for her to enjoy some private time away from the court.

You will VISIT THE PAVILLON FRAIS, also called Salon Frais (Cool Salon) or Pavillon du Treillage, to view the American Friends of Versailles' restoration participation. The Pavillon Frais was constructed during the reign of Louis XV between 1751 and 1753. It was used on warm spring and summer days as a private dining room for the Queen and ladies of court. Marie-Antoinette often included the King. (Business casual, wear your favorite hat and comfortable shoes. No shorts please.) Roundtrip coach transportation will be offered from the Hôtel Ritz, Place Vendome. Picking up close to 11:00 am and departing Versailles at 3:30 pm.

The Hôtel Claude Passart with its lovely garden, is the magnificent 17th century private residence in Paris of the Molyneux. This exquisite hôtel particulier was built from 1618 to 1620 and designed by Gabriel de Soulignac for Claude Passart, the King's Secretary and Notary. The amazing interior and garden are stunning, not to be missed! It has been lovingly and beautifully restored by Pilar and Juan Pablo. We are most appreciative to them for their continued kindness to the American Friends of Versailles.

MISSION STATEMENT

The American Friends of Versailles (AFV) was established on June 30, 1998 as a charitable corporation for improving and promoting a positive American-French relationship. We serve as a sister organization to Les Amis de Versailles. AFV was and continues to be designated as the official representative for Versailles in the United States. The express purpose of the corporation is to encourage support of the Palace of Versailles and its gardens focusing on cultural interchange between the United States and France in the fields of education, architecture, fine and decorative arts, garden architecture and musical endeavors. AFV raises funds for the support of seminars, educational exchange and specific restoration projects within the Palace and its magnificent gardens.

The Palace of Versailles has always had a special place in the Franco-American relationship beginning with Benjamin Franklin, John Adams, and Thomas Jefferson. The French extended their friendship and financial support to the American Revolution; these negotiations took place at Versailles. The Treaty of Versailles, ending the First World War, was signed in the Hall of Mirrors on June 28, 1919. The French attribute John D. Rockefeller Jr. with saving Versailles with his visits and major restoration donations in 1924, 1927-28, and 1932-33. Gerald Van der Kemp, former Chief Curator from 1953 to 1980, with his dynamic American wife, Florence, provided a guiding light, encouraging continuing American involvement with substantial restoration and preservation projects. The Château continues to be the stage where the French greet American Presidents and heads of state hold meetings of world consequence. It is important to note that Americans more than any other foreign nationality visit the Palace regularly.

The American Friends of Versailles has, thus far, restored the Trois Fontaines Bosquet, the Pavillon Frais, the baroque, frescoed ceiling of the Queens' Guards Room, and the replanting of Virginia Tulip trees in the Queen's Grove. AFV has also donated financial support for the trees after the devastating storm in 1999, the research center at Versailles, international cultural seminars hosted there, as well as supporting traveling exhibitions of photographs and art from the Château. The American Friends of Versailles is dedicated to maintaining the American support and an active interest in this UNESCO-designated world-treasure in order to help preserve its history and beauty for future generations.

Roundtrip coach transportation will be offered from the Place Vendome, in front of the Hotel Ritz, to Versailles. You can also meet the coach there if you are not staying at the Ritz.
